

The Oxford – NNF fellowship programme November 2023



We welcome applications from doctors who would like to come and train at our tertiary neonatal unit at Oxford. The fellowship is now in its 13th year and has trained over 110 trainees. The neonatal unit at Oxford provides medical and surgical care to approximately 850 admissions per year with 175 of them being <1500 g at birth. We have a well-developed transport service.

We invite doctors interested in training at our tertiary neonatal unit in Oxford to submit applications. Currently in its 13th year, the fellowship has mentored over 110 trainees. The neonatal unit at Oxford serves all medical and surgical care about 850 patients annually, 175 of whom were under <1500 g at birth. We have a sophisticated transportation system.

- The fellowships are for 2 years, and you need to have completed your MD/DnB in Paediatrics as an essential criteria. Preferably, you should be doing or completed an NNF/IAP neonatal fellowship. A DM degree in Neonatology is welcome.
- You may apply without the IELTS/OET exam but would need to pass before the start
 of the fellowship. Your salary, education, supervision and training opportunities will
 be identical to other UK trainees.
